A message from the President of the Board:

Dear Owners-

Needless to say, the past year has been rather tumultuous. The Village Inn is alive and well even if we have been bruised and bloodied along the way. I am sure you all know our expenses and revenues will be taking a significant hit this year. It started with a large hike in our insurance rates. We were having a reasonably decent season when the poop hit the propeller with the advent of the Covid-19 virus. As you know, the ski area suspended operations and several weeks later announced the season was over. We managed a flurry of cancelations on a week to week basis. Initially, we considered a voucher system where we would push reservation out later in the season or even into next year. The hope was to preserve the cash flow associated with the deposits. As it became clearer the season was over, from a logistical standpoint of managing vouchers and just the pure customer service relationships, we decided that full refunds were the proper way to go. Ka-Ching! Our revenues and inflow of cash stopped and outflow in the form of refunds accelerated. We put the housekeeping staff to doing the "deep cleans" we normally do at the end of the season. We received initial word that our largest summer customer, Phil English and his annual Running Camp and a new program for coaches was in jeopardy. We told Phil we would be flexible and work with him to try and salvage some if not all of his camps. Unfortunately, when Governor Inslee canceled school for the rest of the year, Phil decided that it would be an uphill battle to put the camps on this year. He informed us on 8 April that he would not be doing the camps this year, but he gave us dates for the 2021 year. We do have some small events scheduled this summer that are still on the books, but we must be concerned as to whether they will actually happen or not.

Naturally, there are some major holes in both the Association and the Rental LLC budgets. We are managing a situation that is influx. A decision that looks correct on one day looks like a mistake the next week. The decisions that have been made have been made with the information available and should not be second guessed with the advantage of hindsight. We have secured SBA PPP Loans and are trying to manage them as the rules change daily. The State of Washington has a very limited program that we will also look into for relief.

The long story short is that there is a very nasty Band-Aid that must be ripped off and there is no real way to sugar coat it. We have a property to manage and as owners, we will have to step up as the only remaining source of funds to manage the property. We are working to determine the deficit in the current budgets. At the same time, we are working with Staff to create the budgets for the coming year. We will attempt to minimize the "ouch" but "ouch" there will be.

Before things went south, we had been discussing creating a marketing plan for our shoulder and off seasons. This is a place we all can help defray the current misery. If you have ideas for marketing or know of groups with events – reunions, weddings, meetings, etc. and can help us reach out to market our property, we may be able to jump start this effort and ease the pain.
